Dear Parent/Carer

We are excited to welcome our New Year 7 students to Outwood Academy City Fields this September to begin face-to-face teaching. A full risk assessment based on government guidance has been followed to ensure students can learn in a Covid-secure environment.

Teaching staff have adapted schemes of learning to meet students' needs and the zones/blocks are ready for the year group bubbles. When students arrive on Tuesday they will be given HMGs (Horizontal Mentor Groups). These are the groups that your child will be taught in over the coming weeks. Year 7 will be based in the Science building. Students in Y7 will stay in their allocated room unless they are in PE lessons where they will move to the Sports Hall or on break or lunch.

Years Y7 will start on Tuesday 8 September 2020

Student year groups will arrive and leave via the same set of gates. Student arrival times will be staggered. Students cannot access the site until their identified arrival time.

The Academy gates will open no earlier than 8am, there is a small Magic Breakfast bar available to students who wish to have them which replaces our normal service however these will be based in the Year group bubbles.

There are handwashing and sanitisation stations throughout the Academy and students must make sure that they sanitise:

- upon arrival at school
- when in changing rooms
- returning from breaks and before/after eating
- before and after masks are used

Whilst we recognise that students will have missed the social aspects of school life and being together each day, students must not congregate in the open areas of the Academy at any time and must follow staff direction immediately.

Once students are dismissed at the end of the day they must leave the site immediately and not gather at either entrance or at the local shops.

What can students do to help keep everyone safe?

- It is important to note that the expectations of behaviour have not changed and now, more than ever, students will need to behave in a safe, responsible and respectful way.
- Students should wear full uniform, including school shoes and there should be no jewellery or piercings. There should be no false nails or eyelashes, any other makeup must be discreet.
- Wash or sanitise hands frequently. As a minimum, this should be as they come into school, at break, before and after lunch and as they leave the school.
- Become independent learners and take responsibility for their equipment and books, during the day. This means having their own equipment, they can't borrow it from others. Students will be given exercise books.

Students need to bring:

- Pen
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Highlighter
- Calculator

Students are encouraged to bring:

- Protractor
- Compass
- Sanitiser
- Tissues

We look forward to seeing the school full with students again and fulfilling its purpose in the community. Thank you for your continued support, I speak for all staff when I say we cannot wait to have them back in the Academy.
